Bullying in schools

Forms of bullying:

- teasing, ridiculing victim
- calling victim unpleasant names
- sending abusive text messages / photos
- verbal / physical attacks
- excluding victim (from group activities, parties,...)

Bullying in schools

Characteristics of bullying:

- imbalance of forces: victim alone/isolated
- frequency of attacks: at least once a week
- duration of attacks: several weeks and months
- helplessness of victim: victim cannot solve conflict on his/her own



Victim

- often a passive, sensitive and cautious character
- low self-esteem, fearful, lacks selfconfidence
- does not say much in the classroom
- reserved
- when bullied, he/she withdraws into herself/himself
- family background: sometimes overprotected, strong motherchild relationship



Bully(-ies) — (frequent) behavioural patterns/characteristics/...

- aggressive assertion of interests
- behavioural motive: power
- bullies easily recognize potential weaknesses of victim
- have little empathy
- (often) physically stronger than victim
- (wrongly) feel provoked by victim
- low self-esteem
- no or inadequate conflict resolution strategies
- impulsive lack of self-control
- prospect of instrumental value
- future development: increased risk of criminal and anti-social behaviour



Anti-Bullying Procedure

(developed by Mustafa Janan)

Guiding principles:

- Helping instead of punishing.
- Stopping the anonymity of the bully-victim relationship.
- Giving priority to the protection of victim
- Involving class / learning group as much as possible
- (Informing parents about the intended procedure)

first contact: mediator – victim

(1) victim describes incidents of bully their impact on her/him



- (2) mediator explains intended procedure
- (3) mediator asks for victim's approval
- (4) mediator asks victim to indicate the names of possible 'coaches'

meeting:

mediator — bully(-ies)
• presentation of incidents from the bully's/bullies' point of view



Coaches

 Selection of uninvolved/impartial coaches by bully and victim

 Their function: observation of victim's and bully's/bullies' behaviour and actions

Meeting: mediator – coaches

- briefing of coaches, explaining their functions
- fixing of time frame

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Meeting: mediator – pupils in class

- informing about the situation
- explaining upcoming procedure



One week later

- meeting with victim, bully, coaches
- reports on what the pupils involved (coaches) have observed
- evaluation of procedure
- if necessary, continuation of procedure

Preventive Measures

ANTI-BULLYING initiative at Wittekind-Gymnasium

Fields of work / activities

- regular meetings of the members of this initiative
- lectures on various aspects of bullying, child development, etc., delivered by experts
- training of mediators
- regular theatre projects
- training of pupils (by the police), enabling them to help other pupils in cases of cyber-bullying
